- New Cross-Listed Course Approval: The following cross-listing was approved on February 4th:

- Certificate Deactivations: On February 4th, CCC approved the deactivation of the following certificates, effective fall 2025:
 - Certificate of Achievement in Transfer Studies: CSU GE
 - Certificate of Achievement in Transfer Studies: IGETC

The CSU GE Breadth and IGETC transfer GE patterns are being discontinued starting fall 2025, so we will no longer be allowed to offer these related certificates. A similar certificate for the new Cal-GETC transfer GE pattern is under development.

New Subject Code: The Student Resource and Support Programs (SRC) division has approved a new subject code of Educational Access (EDAC), to replace the current subject code of Special Education (SPED). All active SPED courses will be moved to EDAC, effective summer 2025.

Additionally, at the February 4th meeting, CCC held a second read of a new subject code of Non-Credit: Adult Learning (NCAL). This code is being proposed by the Office of Instruction to be used by all divisions for their noncredit course offerings in the category of Courses for Older Adults. During the discussion, questions and concerns from faculty were brought up regarding the plan to use one subject code across campus instead of department-specific subject codes. In order to facilitate additional discussions on this topic, Ben and Kurt are going to hold listening sessions, open to all—keep any eye on your inbox for more information about when these will be scheduled.

Updating Foothill GE: At the February 4th meeting, CCC held a first read of application forms for each of the areas on the new Foothill GE pattern. The forms had been updated to include some feedback received after they were originally shared at the Jan. 21st meeting, and the group's discussion during the first read resulted in additional suggestions to incorporate. The forms are still a work in progress, and we'd like your input! Please reach out to your CCC Reps or to Ben to get involved in this important work.
