Associate Degree Requirements:

Units required for Major: 36

English proficiency: ENGL 1A, 1AH, 1S & 1T, ESLL 26 or equivalent.

Mathematics proficiency: MATH 17, 105, 108 or equivalent.

A minimum of 90 units is required to include:

- Completion of one of the following general education patterns:
 - o Foothill General Education,
 - o CSU General Education Breadth Requirements or
 - o the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC)
- Core courses (12 units)
- Support courses (24 units)

NOTE: All courses pertaining to the major must be taken for a letter grade. In addition, a grade of "C" or better is required for all core and support courses used for the degree.
