

## AS in Geography

Earn your Associate in Science degree online with a major in Geography at Foothill College.

### Associate Degree Requirements:

**Units required for Major:** 37

**English proficiency:** ENGL 1A, 1AH, 1S & 1T, ESLL 26 or equivalent.

**Mathematics proficiency:** MATH 17, 105, 108 or equivalent.

A minimum of 90 units is required to include:

- Completion of one of the following general education patterns:
  - Foothill General Education,
  - CSU General Education Breadth Requirements or
  - the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC)
- Core courses (21 units)
- Support courses (16 units)

\*Additional elective course work may be necessary to meet the 90-unit minimum requirement for the associate degree.

**NOTE:** All courses pertaining to the major must be taken for a letter grade. In addition, a grade of "C" or better is required for all core and support courses used for the degree.

The **courses listed BELOW are generally offered as online courses** at least once every two years. Please see Schedule of Classes for verification.

- **or** ANTH 2B Patterns of Culture (4 units)
- ECON 25 The Global Economy (4 units)
- GEOG 12 Introduction to Geospatial Technology (4 units)
- **or** GIST 12 Introduction to Geospatial Technology (4 units)
- HIST 4A History of Western Civilization to 800 CE (4 units)
- **or** HIST 4B History of Western Civilization: 700-1800 (4 units)
- POLI 15 International Relations/World Politics (4 units)

And 8 units\* from the following:

- ANTH 6 Peoples of Africa (4 units)
- HIST 18 Introduction to Middle Eastern Civilization (4 units)
- HIST 20 History of Russia & the Soviet Union (4 units)
- POLI 2 Comparative Government & Politics (4 units)
