




Spring 2015 Success Rates in California Community Colleges



CHALLENGE: Social distance felt by online students with faculty and fellow students

SOLUTION:

Increase faculty presence, respectful encouragement, and validation of students

SOLUTION: Build an interpersonal connection with your students



SOLUTION: Build rapport and trust with your students



Respond to students' emails promptly

 Maintain a respectful and courteous tone in your communications

SOLUTION

 Ask your students to develop a set of ground rules for Discussion Board postings to ensure a safe and comfortable class climate for all students



 Nurture interpersonal interactions among your students by using online icebreakers and assigning fun small group tasks

SOLUTION: Encourage faculty to participate in an online class **as a student** PRIOR to teaching an online or hybrid class



CHALLENGE: Online course design lacks appropriate strategies

- Scaffolding
- Active learning
- Universal Design
- Authentic assessment
- Clear instructions for tasks
- Contextualized and relevant content

Scaffolding Example 1

Give students an exemplar or model of an assignment that you will ask them to complete.



Scaffolding Example 2

Provide your students with vocabulary lessons BEFORE assigning them to read a difficult text.

CHALLENGE: Lack of student preparation and guidance in self-directed learning skills

- Communication



SOLUTION: Provide guidance and tools for students to develop self-directed learning skills such as time management





SOLUTION


Create and select instructional videos that are no longer than 6 minutes




Give students versions of course site content that can be easily downloaded and used offline

76% of FHDA students own a smartphone




SOLUTION: Design online course sites and student services webpages that are suitable for use with mobile devices
