PSME had its celebration last week, and the students were asked to speak for one minute each and their stories were inspiring. Although the event was to honor them, the students spoke and honored their professors and the college instead. One said there is something about Foothill College. Another talked about not wanting to leave Foothill; four professors visited him when he was in the hospital. One student of color honored math professor **Patrick Morriss**. She failed math 3 times until she took Prof. **Morriss**' stats class. As she described it, math is like swimming: you test the waters and if you think it is too cold, you sometime give up and convince yourself that you never wanted to go swimming in the first place.

Right now, the California State University is finalizing new statewide math policies requiring Intermediate Algebra — undermining community colleges' equity efforts in the past years. A former dean of Berkeley Law School wrote an article in EdSource: "At Cal State, algebra is a civil rights issue." https://edsource.org/2017/at-cal-state-algebra-is-a-civil-rights-issue/582950

One well known scholarship in the area of math and student performance is called "stereotype threat". I am excited to announce that our opening

day speaker for next year will be UC Berkeley and Stanford Emeritus Professor **Claude Steele** who is most notable for his scholarship on stereotype threat and how it affects minority student academic performance.

Much of the discussion of Intermediate Algebra involves the debate of whether it is needed for non-STEM majors. Although many of our students major in STEM, there is a larger number who do not.

In fact, Foothill wants to encourage students to consider majoring in the humanities, for instance. Foothill-De Anza Community College District and the University of San Francisco recently received a \$2.145 million grant from the Mellon Foundation to do just that. Prof. **Falk Cammin** is one of the main architects of our *Humanities Mellon Scholar* program, and she and the team are recruiting both current and new students right now to the program. Know
