Greetings Foothill College,

I write to you with a heavy heart regarding recent developments in our country, particularly the events over the weekend at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville.

Foothill College is committed to inclusion and equity, and to making good on our promise in the Student Equity Plan. Part of that commitment requires our relentless belief in racial equality and social justice, and that no race is superior.

Our college continues to be a safe place for our students and employees no matter their ethnicity, religion, or gender identity. At the last Board of Trustees meeting, our chancellor advanced and our board voluntarily and unanimously voted to not expend district funds for travel to states that discriminate based on gender identity.

The open display of white supremacy and neo-Nazism should be alarming to all. We also share in the pain for the loss of Ms. Heather Heyer who was killed during the counter-protest in Charlottesville, and all those who were injured. As Ms. Heyer posted last on her Facebook account: "If you're not outraged, you're not paying attention."

The right to free speech is fundamental, but the rally that occurred in Charlottesville is completely counter to the values of Foothill College. There is so much to write and say on this topic, and I honestly think it is better for us to come together as a college (even during the summer) to share and discuss. At President's Cabinet this morning, we discussed an article on how a college could respond to these events and even then, there was not a clear answer.
