

Study California's Ecology & Natural History

Taught by Foothill Biology Instructor **Gillian Schultz, Ph.D.**, the course will examine the rich array of the Golden State's animal and plant species—many of which are found nowhere else in the world.

Through a combination of field trips, lab assignments and lectures, you'll develop a better understanding of and appreciation for the ecology and natural history of the San Francisco Bay Area. 
Earning Your Bachelor's Degree Just Got Easier Transfer Admission Agreements Streamline Completion of Your B.A.



Study in Ghana, Ecuador or London Plan Now to Study Abroad

Learning comes alive when you participate in the Foothill-De Anza Campus Abroad Program in Ghana, (Summer 2008); Ecuador (Summer 2008); or London (Fall 2008). Foothill and De Anza college faculty lead these excursions and teach the program's required courses.

You'll enroll in up to 12 units of courses such as literature, language, art and history as you tour historic landmarks and experience life and culture in a foreign country. For the Ecuador trip, you'll participate in a hands-on archeological dig in the Andes Mountains.

Ecuador—July 6–Aug. 10

Join an international team of researchers for anthropological and archaeological coursework, field trips and service learning projects, including investigating the pre-Columbian fortresses of Pambamarca.

Ghana—Aug. 29–Sept. 13

Live and study as Ghanaians do as you examine gender, culture, political history, economic issues, environmental protection, and public health care. Your coursework will help you develop a better understanding of the ways in which historical events impact the lives of contemporary Ghanaians.

London—Oct. 25–Dec. 7

The seat of the longest surviving monarchy becomes an extension of your classroom and you have the opportunity to explore world-renown theatres, monuments, churches, museums and galleries.

The program fee for each trip includes housing, meals, social activities and cultural excursions. Group airfare may be offered and financial aid is available. Space is limited. You must have a 2.5 grade point average and completed 12 units of college credit prior to departure.

Is a Career Teaching Math or Science Right for You?

Foothill College offers an innovative teacher-training program, in which you can gain experience teaching math and science at the elementary-, middle- or high-school level. To participate, you should enroll in Foothill's *PSE 41, 42 or 43* class. You'll then be paired with experienced mentor teachers at the K-12 level for three hours per week for a total of nine weeks.

You'll observe instruction in the K-12 classroom setting, teach small groups of students, participate in relevant discussions pertaining to education, and learn how to become a credentialed K-12 teacher in California. You'll also attend a one-hour lecture each week at Foothill. In addition to receiving a \$500 learning stipend, this hands-on teaching experience can help you decide if a career as a math or science teacher is right for you.



Prerequisites for this program include a satisfactory score on the mathematics placement test or completion of the intermediate algebra course (*MATH 104 or 105*). It's recommended that you have successfully completed a college-level chemistry, biology or physics course, or have a recommendation from a math or science faculty member. You are required to undergo a TB test and background investigation, both are offered at no charge, on the Foothill campus prior to visiting K-12 classrooms.


Spring Sports & Fitness Get Out There!

Prepare for University Transfer

The class will link you to the more than 300 Foothill alumni who have agreed to be transfer allies. You'll also get tips on the transfer application process and begin writing an effective application essay for successful admission to a four-year college or university.

5, 6, 7, 8: Dance History

In salsa clubs, ballroom floors and on your television, dancing is a hot trend. Learn more about this expressive performing art in the four-unit *HP 70: Topics in Dance History* online class. You'll study the evolution of dance from its roots in ancient rituals to today's popular moves. In addition to exploring the influences and emergence of dance styles of world cultures, you'll learn how to appreciate dance from a technical, artistic and historical perspective. The course also emphasizes the key artists and events that have created and shaped the art of dance.

Theatre Arts Appreciation

The curtain goes up on live theatre when you enroll in Foothill's four-unit online *DRAM 1: Theatre Arts Appreciation* course. Learn about the various components of the theatre process, including acting, playwriting, designing, directing, and how they all come together to produce magic on the stage. The class is an excellent opportunity to learn about theatre as you attend four live performances of your choice and relate your theatre-going experience to your online class. The instructor will provide a listing of various performances, many of which are low cost or free to attend.

Introduction to College for the Health Sciences Student

Find out if a career in the health care industry is right for you by enrolling in Foothill's one-unit *CNSL 100: Introduction to College for the Health Sciences Student* online class. In addition to meeting alumni who have completed Foothill's popular health care programs, you'll review the requirements for Foothill's Dental Assisting, Dental Hygiene, Diagnostic Medical Sonography, Primary Care, Emergency Medical Technician, Paramedic, Pharmacy Technician, Respiratory Therapy, Radiologic Technology, Radiation Therapy and Veterinary Technology programs. You'll also learn what classes and steps you need to take to be eligible to apply for these programs. When you successfully complete this course, you'll also receive priority registration for Summer Session. The course is offered on a pass/no pass basis.

Study with John, Paul, George & Ringo

Why have so many Beatle song titles and lyrics made their way into everyday language? Was Yoko Ono really responsible for breaking up the Beatles? Do today's bands like Red Hot Chili Peppers and Stone Temple Pilots incorporate Beatles' styles into their music? Get the answers to these and other questions by enrolling in the four-unit *MUS 7D: The Beatles in the Culture of Popular Music* online course. You'll learn how the band formed, the factors that influenced their style and about their tremendous influence on rock 'n' roll. Some of the topics covered include an in-depth look at each of the Beatles' albums; focus on the band's most prominent songs; the Beatles after their break up in 1970; and the impact of the Beatles on today's pop culture.

Destination Specialist: Southern Europe

Learn about the treasures of Southern Europe by enrolling in two-unit *TC 82E: Destination Specialist—Southern Europe* online course. The class is designed for travel industry professionals and travel enthusiasts. You'll study the geographical, historical, political and cultural features of each country, and their major tourism areas. The class emphasizes professional sales strategies and techniques, suggested itineraries and industry resources. Upon successful completion of the course, you will be eligible to take an exam administered by the Travel Institute and earn a destination specialist certificate that is recognized throughout the travel industry.

Writing in English With Confidence

Develop the skills you need to write in English with confidence by enrolling in the three-unit *ESL 186: Advanced Grammar Review* online course. Designed for students whose first language is not English, the class emphasizes essential grammar review. Through skill-building assignments, you'll determine which are your problem areas and the strategies you can use to write with confidence.
