Dynamics of a Changing Ocean, Atmosphere & Climate

Learn more about the Earth system as well as the facts and consequences of changing oceans, atmosphere and climate by enrolling in Foothill's oceanography or weather processes classes. These classes are transferable as physical science courses to all California State University and University

The four-unit OCEN 10: General Oceanography course examines the evolution of the ocean floor over time, the dynamics of the oceans themselves, and the fragile coastline and coastal ocean. Special emphasis will be given to human interaction with the ocean system. Mega waves, tsunami, earthquakes and volcanic processes will also be discussed.
