By contrast, the "tortilla curtain" represents the limpness or weakness of U.S. border policy and reflects the wall that separates white Americans from those of Mexican descent physically, psychologically and emotionally.

Boyle will visit Foothill for a guest reading and discussion of the piece **Wednesday, May 14, at 3 p.m.** in Room 1501. Admission to these events is free and the public is invited.

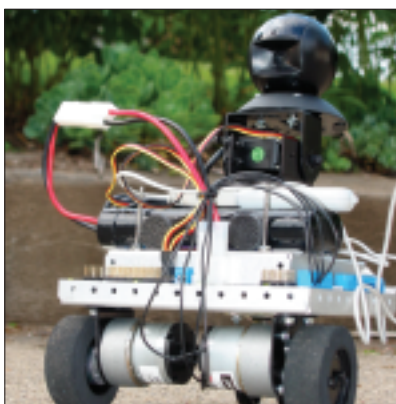
## Engineering with Robotics Design & Build a Robot

## Teacher-Training Program Is a Career as a Math or Science Teacher Right for You?

Foothill now offers you an innovative teacher-training program, which will place you in local kindergarten through 10<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms to observe, participate and assist a mentor-teacher with daily instructional processes. The program also offers you a \$500 learning stipend.

By completing Foothill's math and science coursework as well as these inventive field experiences, you'll be better able to determine if you want to pursue a bachelor's degree in teaching as well as a California teaching credential in math or science.

To participate in this program, you must concurrently enroll in Foothill's *CHEM 41* and *CHEM 42: Class Practices* courses. 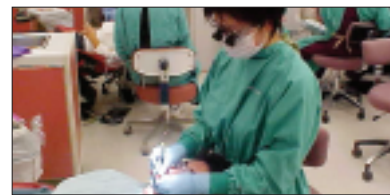
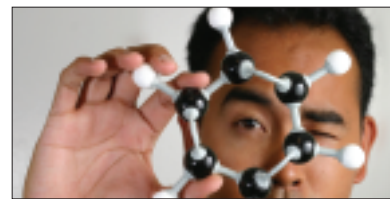
