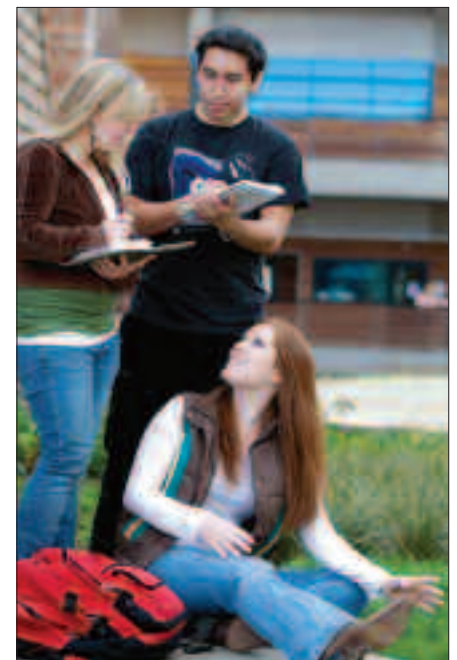

There's Room for You at Foothill But You Need to Plan & Act Now Early Is the Key to Hassle-Free Experience in Tight Economic Times

Even though economic times are tough, there's still a place for you at Foothill College, but to take advantage of this, you must plan ahead and act early to ensure that your Fall Quarter gets off to a smooth start.

With statewide budget cuts and other economic pressures, college officials expect more students at Foothill this fall. Because more students will be registering for Foothill classes, you'll need to act early. Use July, August and September to review the online schedule; take placement tests, if necessary; schedule a meeting with a Foothill counselor after you've completed the application process; register for your classes; and take Foothill's one-unit *CNSL 50: Introduction to College* course this summer. Also, be certain to pay your fees within five days of registering to avoid being dropped from classes.

You'll be disappointed if you show up the day before school starts or on day one of classes and expect to get into your first choice of classes, especially those that meet during peak morning hours, and in core classes like math, English, and other courses with traditionally high enrollment.



Start Smart: Take *Introduction to College* Class This Summer

The *CNSL 50* course gives you an orientation to the programs and services that are available to you at Foothill College. You'll also review academic policies and get an overview of California's higher education system, including UC, CSU and private universities. In addition to exploring career programs, university transfer options and guaranteed university admission programs, you'll work with a counselor to design your educational plan so that you take the classes you need to achieve your college and career goals.

Many summer *CNSL 50* classes, which meet for just one week, are offered in late July, throughout August and in early September. Most fall *CNSL 50* courses are self-paced and some are offered entirely online. To review course times, access the online schedule. You may be exempt from the course if you have verifiable proof that you've completed an orientation course at another college, or completed 12 or more college units. 2. Take placement tests for math and English or ESL. Learn more at www.foothill.edu/placement;

4. Pay your fees within five days of registration or you'll be dropped from classes.

The more than 500 students who participate in Extended Opportunity Programs & Services (EOPS) at Foothill College have had one of the most expensive costs of a college education—course textbooks—funded by two visionary community groups.

Foothill's EOPS Book Service Program recently received \$15,000 from the **Rotary Club of Palo Alto** and \$7,500 from the **Palo Alto Weekly Holiday Fund**. The contributions have been used to purchase college textbooks for students who are enrolled in Foothill classes, and who would otherwise be unable to afford the textbooks that are required for college

courses. Many donors were surprised to learn that a single book for just one class can cost as much as \$175.

EOPS is a state-funded student support program that serves a highly diverse population of financially and educationally disadvantaged college students. The program's goal is to provide eligible students access to the support services required to successfully complete a program of higher education.
