How Title IX Affects You and Where to Find Help

WHAT IS TITLE IX?

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 prohibits gender-based sex discrimination and harassment in educational programs and activities at institutions that receive federal financial funding for employment, academic, educational, extracurricular and athletic activities. Here's how Title IX affects you:

- **Protects all people regardless of their gender or gender identity** from sex discrimination, including sexual harassment and sexual violence, which are forms of discrimination; and
- **Requires institutions to take necessary steps to prevent sexual assault** on their campuses, and to respond promptly and effectively when an assault is reported.

CONSENT VS. SEXUAL ASSAULT

Consent is an ENTHUSIASTIC affirmative statement.

In California, "affirmative consent" is defined as positive cooperation. Consent must be freely and voluntarily given, and participants must have knowledge and understanding of the act.

Consent cannot be given when force, threat of force, coercion or fraud is used to gain compliance.

Consent **cannot** be given when someone:

- is incapacitated due to alcohol or other drug use
- is asleep or unconscious
- is under the legal age of consent, which is 18 years old in California
- has limited mental capacity due to a disability or mental illness

If you're unsure, ask questions like:

"Is this okay?" "Do you want to keep going?" "Does this feel good?" "I'd like to ___, are you okay with that?"

DEALING WITH STALKING

Trust Your Instincts. If something feels off, ask for help.

Get to Safety. Find the nearest office or public space.

Call for Help. Contact Campus Police or 911

Request a Safety Escort. Campus Police can accompany you to your car or class if you feel unsafe.

Document It. Save messages, screenshots & note dates.

Don't Engage. Block them. Keep all evidence.

Report It. Contact Title IX Coordinator.

Get Support. Counseling Center offers emotional & mental health care.
