- ❖ State Approval Received: We've received state approval for three new Certificates of Achievement, which were approved by CCC during winter quarter: Education Technology Specialist, Emerging Educational Technology Leadership, STEAM Instructional Leadership. Congratulations to the LINC department!
- ❖ Program Deactivation: On May 18th, CCC approved the deactivation of the Instructional Design and Technology program (Certificate of Achievement), effective 2021-22.
- ❖ Cooperative Work Experience Education: On May 18th, CCC approved the Cooperative Work Experience Education Plan. This district-wide plan is being created by the Workforce Development (Apprenticeship) Divisions at De Anza and Foothill, to enable the colleges to offer Cooperative Work Experience Education courses (CWE subject code). The plan will be sent to the FHDA Board of Trustees for approval at an upcoming meeting.
- Guided Pathways Mapping Approval Process: At the May 18th meeting, CCC held a first read of the Guided Pathways Program Map Approval Process. The draft process is based on recent discussions at CCC to determine the steps for review and approval of final drafts of Program Maps. To view the draft process and provide your own feedback, please contact your CCC Reps.
- ❖ FSA Information Session: Also on May 18th, CCC welcomed a guest speaker—Kathy Perino, Math faculty and Faculty Association Chief Negotiator. Kathy provided information about FSAs (Faculty Service Areas), which are defined by each community college district and are different from disciplines (which are defined at the state level and used across all districts to set minimum qualifications for faculty). FSAs are assigned to both full-time faculty and courses, and are used only when there are full-time tenured faculty layoffs—FSAs help determine who has the right to keep their job, and who gets laid off. The CCC Team is currently working with divisions to fill in FSAs for courses that are missing this information, and we thank Kathy for an informative session!
