Action Items:

Discussion on the five GE Applications for AC Mechanic:

- For the new GE Pattern to be implemented in Fall of 2025, new GE applications were created, and faculty worked closely with the training center for the following GE areas:
Natural Sciences, Oral Communication, Quantitative Reasoning, Social Sciences, Lifelong Learning

All GE applications were shared with all programs for feedback.

Brian motioned for approval, and Tim seconded: GE applications were approved to move forward.

- New Course: APPT 121A: Basic Plumbing Service Skills
- New Course: APPT 128I: Beginning Drawing & Design
Brian shared this will be a new program and these new courses will be a part of it. Stand Alone forms for these courses has been completed and a certificate application will come forward in the Fall.

Tim motioned for approval, Brian seconded and these new COR's were approved to move forward.



- Foothill College has partnered with Cupertino Electric for a non-credit pathway for their journey workers, 91 new course proposals were submitted and in the Fall, non-credit certificates will be created.
Chris shared additional context regarding these new non-credit courses, and a non-credit certificate will be designed in the Fall.
- JRYM 100: Tim reactivated the course, which is for current instructors to receive the required 60-hour training for their credential.
Chris will ask for this course to be fast-tracked if needed. This is a reactivation.
