OERI Summer Projects

The OERI is presently recruiting faculty for three projects. While the goal would be to complete these projects over the summer, depending on the responses to this recruitment message and the availability of the selected participants, the timeframe may be extended. Each of the proposed projects would involve resource-specific general updates, refinements based on the OERI Inclusivity, Diversity, Equity, and Antiracism (IDEA) Framework Assessment, and other modifications as specified.

- <u>OpenStax Introduction to Business</u> this text will be reviewed with a focus on ensuring currency, relevance, and relatability.
- <u>OpenStax Introductory Psychology</u> this text will be reviewed with a focus on ensuring currency, relevance, and relatability.
- Public Speaking text to be determined. This project will specifically focus on integrating content to ensure the resource is aligned to both the <u>Common Course</u> <u>Numbering COMM C1000 template</u> and the requirements necessary for a course to be approved for <u>Cal-GETC Area 1C (Oral Communication)</u>. Any added content will also be made available for integration into other OER.

Discipline faculty interested in participating in these projects will need to <u>complete the</u> <u>OERI Summer 2025 Project Application</u> no later than Thursday, June 12, 2025.

ADAPT Webinar Series •

<u>ADAPT</u> is a comprehensive online assessment/homework infrastructure that provides faculty the ability to create assessments that include auto-graded and non-auto-graded activities from different platforms such as H5P, MyOpenMath, WeBWorK, and its own native ADAPT questions. Faculty are continually developing and sharing new questions and activity types, so the ways to assess students' learning are limitless. ADAPT can be integrated into Canvas with full grade integration or it can be run independently.

This series of webinars is intended to introduce users to ADAPT. Each hands-on onehour webinar is followed by 30 minutes for questions and answers.

This year's annual LibreFest workshop hosted by LibreTexts will be held virtually the week of July 7-11, 2025.

This virtual workshop will provide four and a half days of teaching and working sessions covering: how to create Open Education Resources (OER); how to edit/modify existing OER to build textbooks and other learning resources; how to use our Conductor project management platform with our new Workbench; and our ADAPT open homework and assessment system. We will also hear Success Stories from LibreTexts super users each day.

Sessions will begin at 9:00 am PST on Monday, July 7. Office hours will be held every day from 8:00 - 9:00 am. There will be time for questions and reflections at the close of each day's sessions from 3:00 - 4:00 pm.
