Planning is also underway for the District Classified Professional Development Day, scheduled for Friday, March 20 (Week 11 of Winter Quarter). The next planning meeting will be held on December 11, and varying levels of engagement are available to accommodate different workloads.

Equity 3.0 Follow-up, Ajani Byrd, Dean | Institutional Equity, Diversity & Inclusion

The Equity 3.0 plans to align multiple college plans under one major overarching plan, which was recently approved, and considered how to ensure ongoing progress toward this unified goal. Ajani noted that the process is currently in Week 9, during which final drafts are being shared with various constituencies. Equity 3.0 was presented as an action plan that supports the college's Blueprint for Success—an extension of the blueprint rather than a separate document—and is required for completing Grant 4.9. Leads are asked to share their work to ensure that the efforts are meaningful, realistic, and measurable. The plan includes five core focus areas, with an intensive emphasis on Black/African American and Latine students, recognizing them as historically marginalized groups. Discussion also centered on student educational plans, appointment patterns, and a case-management approach, noting that counselors are significantly outnumbered and exploring how to address systemic issues without hiring additional staff. The plan connects with Vision 2030 alignment and coordination, acknowledging that registration plays a major role in students'

ability to attain their educational goals. MANAPUA was highlighted as a promising practice for its whole-campus approach to community building and mentorship. Questions about logistics were raised, with a reminder of a Wednesday deadline, and participants were encouraged to check in with administrators to hold them accountable and monitor progress.

Google AI Tools and Certificates Rollout, Kevin Kelly | Executive Director (Interim) of the Digital Center for Innovation for California Community Colleges

The group discussed upcoming Google-provided training opportunities, with more details to be shared soon, including examples like IBM training on AI tool use. Colleges and districts that have enabled AI tools, such as El Camino College, described being interested in adopting the technology but cautious about protecting student information; they signed on but initially kept the tools disabled while gathering more information and determining appropriate audiences. In the meantime, they are using available tools and training to prepare. A central concern raised was how to balance preparing students to use AI for future careers while still fostering strong critical thinking skills and preventing overreliance on AI. Different colleges are piloting different tools—for example, San Mateo County enabled Google AI for students, staff, and faculty after Thanksgiving, following extended discussions and reassurances about data protection and the fact that user data does not feed Google's models. Google also offers weekly office hours, and users can access Al tools through Microsoft logins without needing a Gmail account. Privacy safeguards were reviewed, with confirmation that the tools meet FERPA, HIPAA, and ISO compliance requirements, and that Google agrees not to use data to train large language models. It was emphasized that students using personal Google accounts for Gemini do not receive the same data protections, so they should use their Foothill login.
