The Distance Education plan should be used to:

- Guide decision-making and policy to ensure federal and state guidelines and regulations pertaining to distance education are met.
- Guide decision-making to ensure the infrastructure supporting quality online teaching and learning is sufficiently funded and is aligned to our college mission and goals.
- Inform resource allocation.
- Plan professional development opportunities (in collaboration with the Office of Equity) that support campus equity goals related to online teaching and learning.
- Support student and faculty success in online teaching and learning.

- 3. Strengthen the Online EcoSystem
- 4. Grow the OL department
- 5. Create a process for ensuring data security, privacy, and accessibility
- 6. Provide robust professional learning for all faculty teaching online
- 7. Ensure all courses meet FH online course quality requirements, including accessibility
- 8. Provide robust support for all online students
- 9. Provide robust services for all online students
- 10. Strengthen program review
- 11. Strengthen onboarding

To support progress on goals, the Online Learning department:

- 1. Work with the Teaching with Technology committee on an action plan that includes developing a communication pipeline from Online Learning to Academic Senate.
- 2. Attend appropriate conferences and webinars, and subscribe to news lists to ensure the Online Learning team is up to date on policies and technology shifts that affect online teaching.
- 3. Develop professional learning assets that support Foothill faculty.
- 4. Develop a process for ensuring software meets privacy, security, and accessibility guidelines.
- 5. Develop a process for reviewing courses.
- 6. Work with Student Services to ensure the needs of online students are met.
- 7. Redesign onboarding.

Provide an update on the plan progress—where do you stand in the process of accomplishing the Plan's objective(s)? [word limit 150]

Online learning has partnered with the Teaching with Technology committee to redesign the committee structure, including moving to bi-weekly meetings and ensuring work done by the committee is routinely discussed in Academic Senate.

In conjunction with TwT, we have developed a rubric for adopting new online tools, though this is not uniformly used. We're working with ETS to develop a process for checking security and privacy of any cloud-based tool, but this process will need vetting at a district level.

We continue to provide both face-to-face and online workshops for faculty, however, outside of FLEX, those workshops were poorly attended in AY 23-24.

We have redesigned Canvas Certification to align with shifting federal and state guidelines for Regular and Substantive Interaction and accessibility, and are working on formats to support Hybrid and face-to-face modalities.
