RE: Student (Tech) Needs Survey 1 Results

Overview

Foothill College ended winter quarter moving to a fully virtual online campus (due to COVID-19) and in preparation to better serve student in the spring quarter, all students were invited to participate in an online survey by email. The survey was open from April 7, 2020 to April 17, 2020. Out of the 11,100 students who were sent an initial survey invite email, 1,739 students completed the survey, which reflects a 16% response rate. A review of the major findings follow and the full survey results are included in the Appendix.

Survey Results Highlights

- Survey respondents were more likely to be female (55%), between the ages of 20 to 39 (51%), and Asian (29%). Compared to the overall campus population, African American, Latinx, and White students were underrepresented.
- The majority of respondents indicated that a laptop computer would be their primary device for completing schoolwork (81% or 1,403).
- Roughly half of respondents indicated that they had consistent **and** reliable internet access (56% or 945). Note that special population groups indicate slightly lower rates of internet consistency and reliability: 52% (24) among AB540; 43% (19) among EOPS; and 52% among CCPG/PELL respondents.
- The majority of respondents indicated they have previously used Canvas and are either very comfortable (52% or 911) or at least somewhat comfortable (32% or 564) with it.
- Over one-third of respondents indicated they have previously used Zoom and are somewhat comfortable with it (38% or 656) while another one-fourth indicated they are very comfortable with the video/audio conferencing software (24% or 408).
- About two-thirds of respondents indicated that they do not know what Proctorio is (65% or 1,125).
- The top three support services respondents indicated they wanted to see in the virtual hub include: (1) Laptop access/Internet resources; (2) Discuss technology issues with a live person; and (3) How-to videos/Guides on software.

- Most of the respondents indicated that should the college have information to share, their preferred method of communication is through email (89% or 1,542).
- At least one-third of respondents indicated that mental health is a current issue that may be of significant concern for them as the quarter progresses (36% or 627). Other issues of significant concern identified include having a place to study (34% or 594); solving technology issues (34% or 584); being able to find tutoring support (30% or 530); having reliable finances (29% or 503); and ensuring internet access (26% or 456)

Open-Ended Comment Highlights

- Is there something else you'd like to see offered through the virtual center? If so, what would you like to see offered?
 - *Alternative options to Zoom/Proctorio (especially considering the security flaws with the former)*
 - *Can we have access to softwares such as Photoshop, word etc. these are easy to access on campus but many at home can't afford them*
 - *Digital versions of more of the library books, such as the DSM-V (it was only available in library when I checked on website, and could not use the e-book version for psych essay)*
 - *References to virtual options for counseling / psych services, for students who are struggling with mental health due to these circumstances.*
 - *I would love to have Foothill continue the practice of inviting guests and faculty to give talks and lectures virtually. These events have been very enriching for myself and others, and would help create a sense of community while we are all isolated.*

 - *Childcare*
 - *I won't be able to complete my lab classes*
 - *Textbook needed to be bought, can't due to financial issues (usually goes to Foothill library)*
- Anything you would like to tell us about spring quarter and the move to the virtual campus?
 - *A lot of students struggling with online learning, myself included. I think professors' flexibility in terms of grading could alleviate a lot of students' stress. Perhaps extending the pass/fail decision deadline could help students manage their stress as well!*
 - *As someone with ADHD, I have accommodations that are necessary for me to succeed. I'm worried that online classes will be a huge struggle for me.*
 - *Classes that require special facilities and hands on learning, such laboratory, some art, and physical ed classes, will fail to teach necessary skills. For instance, watching an instructor making a ceramic pot or doing a chemical titration is nothing like doing it yourself. Practice is essential to learning how to do it.*
 - *For some classes the whole curriculum is hard to understand based on how the information is presented and organized through canvas.*
 - *I have noticed in previous quarters at Foothill that some professors are better at managing student needs online than others. For some, it is challenging to get a*

response from them in a timely manner via email or Canvas. I worry that a lack of communication and engagement, which is especially needed for online courses, will make the coursework more challenging than it needs to be. I also worry about having just the professor as a point of contact for the course (as opposed to other professors, students, tutors, etc.). That is all much easier to coordinate in person.

Methodology

The survey was designed with guidance from Student Services leadership and created using Remark survey software. Walmart e-certificates were raffled off to participants who provided their contact information. All enrolled students were invited to participate in the online survey and an incentive was offered. The survey was also publicized by individual faculty and accessible through the college website. All duplicate entries (n=40) were removed from the final analysis, and these respondents' most recent entry was kept for analysis. The survey opened Tuesday, May 7, 2020 and closed Friday, May 17, 2020. Out of 11,100 students who were sent the survey invite email, 1,739 completed the survey for a 16% response rate. Roughly 80% of those students who opened the survey link completed the survey (1,739 out of 2,169). Students who provided their CWID were then matched to provide aggregate demographic data (1,428 out of 1,739 or 82%). AB540, EOPS, and CCPG/PELL students were identified based on lists provided by Admissions & Records, IRP, and Financial Aid.

As a matter of fact, I don't like to lecture online by zoom. I have to sit in front of the computer and wait for the class on time every day. I prefer to use my time more comfortably through other learning methods.

As an international dental hygiene student, I am responsible of paying five (5) times as much for my tuition compared to an in-state student. I payed approximately 5000 dollars for Spring tuition and approximately 2000 dollars for my written, as well as the practical dental hygiene national board exams.

As long as teachers are consistent, supportive & open to helping, their students should do pretty well. Some classes will be really hard to take online & if teachers aren't understanding, many students will not pass classes

As many classes are now Hybrid courses, there are people like me who have internet access but the mbps on my laptop is much lower than my phone so Zoom calls are quite impossible to keep up with when you are being dropped every 10 minutes or so (this has happened to me). Switching to my phone worked 10x better but not everyone has multiple devices.

As many international students study from abroad during these times, I think it is advisable for instructors to require books that have an e-book format so that students have an easier time trying to get the material.

Because I noticed, that some of the books in some classes are only available in paperback, so we cannot amazon it overseas (or if it is even possible, it would be very expensive in shipping)

As of right now I don't.

As part of the dental hygiene program the expenses are quite high. The cost of becoming licensed to practice (exam fees among others) are stressful. It would be ideal given this current situation if the governor withdrew these requirements.

As someone with ADHD, I have accommodations that are necessary for me to succeed. I'm worried that online classes will be a huge struggle for me.

Assignments should be only submitted through Canvas. I don't find email reliable enough.

Be safe/stay home

Books for all classes should be easily accessible during this time, not be ordered as delivery takes so much time. It just came up in one class email and it was difficult to get a book be delivered 1 week before class started but luckily a student helped out finding a free online resource provided. Overall super thankful and glad for students reaching out helping each other, including professors.

Can you maybe not drop online classes preventing some students from graduating. If everything is online does the limit to how many students in a class matter anymore?

Canvas platform has a terrible limited space to do homework. The window opens very small

Canvas used as well to get access to work and videos. Some teachers I know don't use canvas and I highly suggest required for them to use.

Cause online courses need much more time to do self-teaching, so maybe the courses need to become easier.

Class registration restrictions due to timing conflicts. If everything is virtual, I don't see the wisdom in keeping these time slots within the virtual setting.

Classes that require special facilities and hands on learning, such laboratory, some art, and physical ed classes, will fail to teach necessary skills. For instance, watching an instructor making a ceramic pot or doing a chemical titration is nothing like doing it yourself. Practice is essential to learning how to do it.

Teacher even suggested I try to join another library system. Yeah sure Cupertino has it but non residents were paying \$80 a year 6 years ago. Why doesn't Foothill have Kanopy?

Due to recent security concerns with zoom, would be better to switch to microsoft teams. Especially since it's already part of office suite that our email comes through.

Even though I've taken online classes before, we lost a week and teachers are attempting to cram the 12 weeks of class into 11 which is an added stressor.

Figuring out on being on top of due dates and having better WiFi connection.

Financial assistance with a tuition discount would be very helpful.

I applied for the online class only.

I appreciate that Foothill College is doing everything they can to keep students, faculty, and staff safe and healthy. I'm confident in Foothill College's ability to provide quality education and services remotely, and I feel lucky that Foothill has been a leader in distance learning and therefore already has lots of experience in that area.

I appreciate the efforts put forth by the professors to integrate online learning!

I appreciate the time and dedication of my professors to make an effort to help us move online and tailor their classes so that we can learn despite the difficulty of not being able to teach in person. It is very helpful so far and I am thankful that they are so understanding and supportive!

I do not do well with only online or ebooks. My learning style is best when I attend an in-person class, so I have only signed up for hybrid or in-person class. Also, unfortunately, I dropped a Human Anatomy class this quarter because of it being virtual so hopefully will be able to take in the fall in person with in person lecture and lab.

I don't like having to use Zoom and being required to keep my webcam on even when it is being recorded. This is a privacy issue that needs to be addressed. Students should not be pressured to turn on their webcams.

I feel it will be more difficult and a little scared about this quarter. I had tried online classes first quarter and they didn't go well.

I generally like using the Canvas environment. I prefer online classes, so fine with me.

I also worry about having just the professor as a point of contact for the course (as opposed to other professors, students, tutors, etc). That is all much easier to coordinate in person.

I still have problems registering for one of my spring quarter classes. It takes too long to get email responses from foothill admissions (although my teacher responds very promptly). I think professors should receive more technical support todo assist students during this covid-19 And ir helped a lo when you offered financial aid

I think providing some guidance as to how to get physical book copies would be helpful, since I personally am not a fan/do not learn best when the textbook is online.

I think the biggest concern is that you can't meet your classmates and socialize with new people. Also you lose the opportunity to join some clubs or activities. I don't know if there's any ways to deal with that.

I think the biggest issue with the Dental Hygiene program is finances. Because our licensing exams were pushed back so far, we will have to be in school longer and won't be able to start working as soon as we had anticipated. Yes. I wish teachers would be more empathetic and offer the lectures with a asynchronous option. Some want to only live stream. This is hard. I am a single mother who works full time. I would normally have child care but now I don't. I can keep up. But I need to care for my kids and can't do 5:30-10:20 pm class without feeding my kids. Have teachers be flexible and understanding. Not offering too many assignments just to make up for missed class time outside of class. Treat us like adults and let us study with reasonable assignments not just busy work. Offer the option to view the lecture outside class hours.

Yes. It would be great to advise zoom structure to all classes. I've noticed students on my zoom calls for classes of 30 students all have questions but use chat mostly. There is a lot of time wasted with chats coming in and students interrupting professor to ask questions that can be held for when the teacher is finished with the area he/she is covering. Sometimes the professor will be going over material and has to toggle back and forth because there is one chat from a student frequently. Its distracting and time consuming. It should be protocol that if a student has a question during a zoom call, they must unmute themselves to ask - just like they would in in person instruction. This will allow for smoother zoom flow and get the class moving. Its been frequent that the same questions are asked and answered because students are either not paying attention the first time or stepped away. Since this will happen no matter what, then students should unmute themselves and ask questions this way and refrain from using chat. Chat consumes too much time. It makes a HUGE difference! Maybe send zoom etiquette to Foothill students to try and use the mute/unmute as much as possible and refrain from using chat. Imagine seeing 30 chats responding to a question such as, yes.

You have all done an amazing job!!

You're doing a great job! Thank you so much.

Your e-library tutorials are out of date and useless. Please update them.

Zoom is integrated with Canvas, uncomfortable with its current security and privacy issues.




