Our **MIP-C** (Mission (I’m) Possible Council (a play on “impossible”), a name given affectionately by our students when they were helping form our collegewide governance group, has a formal name: Mission-Informed Planning Council, which further highlights the focus of our governance, on our mission rather than being primarily constituency-focused. We are currently developing guiding principles for resource allocation and reduction, as well as working on our Mission Statement. Our resource allocation process for the designation of faculty FTEs has been slightly modified to be less cumbersome and yet inclusive. Representatives from MIP-C who are ex-officio representatives of the academic and classified senates and FA met with the deans to assess new department/division faculty FTE requests. As you should know, all vacant FTEs (for example, due to retirement) go into a central pool and are not automatically filled without review. Between these retirement slots, positions that were approved last year but were not filled, and student demand, we have a total of 16 full-time faculty positions to be filled for fall 2023. This means that we are embarking on an aggressive and accelerated search process beginning in January. The positions to be filled are: Pharm Tech, EMS, Music, and Child Development (held over from failed searches last year). Our additional positions are: Respiratory Therapy, Vet Tech, Biology, Psychology, Accounting, Computer Science, Library, Math, English, Counseling, and Photo. *As with all of our full-time faculty positions, all of these searches will be conducted with in person semi-final and*

final interviews, as our faculty assignments, by default, are in person, with selected virtual options if the program warrants it.
