In 2004-05 (when I was president previously), Foothill was enjoying its leadership in online classes and we wanted to continue our leadership in educational technology, being in the heart of the Silicon Valley. That year I attended several conferences and was introduced to holograms, which was using light source technology to depict a 3-D image in the very space I was in, think of beaming people in in *Star Trek* movies. My thought was that it would be so compelling if students in a U.S. History class could actually see Martin Luther King, in 3-D, in their classroom, giving the "I Have A Dream" speech. We had a few companies come to campus to give us hologram demonstrations, and clearly, what we envisioned, could happen. I have a dream today,*" (1963). Now, 60 years later, what progress have we made? And how much of that progress rests with us as educators of the current and next generation?
