**2024 Excellence in Placement
Methodology: Success in Transfer-Level Coursework
November 2024**

In 2024, the Campaign for College Opportunity will present awards for community colleges in California that are successfully supporting students to succeed in transfer-level coursework. These awards will feature categories identifying campuses that are ensuring Latinx and Black students who enroll are supported to pass their transfer-level courses within a year of their initial enrollment in the discipline.

Note: In prior years, we had additional award categories honoring campuses that successfully enrolled 100% of their students into transfer-level coursework. Over the years, the number of colleges who hit this threshold has grown dramatically, and as of this year, over 50 campuses successfully met our criteria across both English and math courses. In recognition of this fact, we will be discontinuing these categories going forward. While we will no longer be awarding campuses for this achievement, it bears mentioning that this outcome is an unmitigated success for all advocates and supporters of equitable placement policies. We continue to laud all community colleges who have made the efforts necessary to maximize their students' chances of success and look forward to more moments of triumph in the future.

We have selected the top 3 campus performers in the following 8 categories:

- Campuswide Transfer-Level English Success
 - ◆ Highest success rate for all students in English transfer-level courses
 - ◆ Equity Designation: Highest success rate for Black students in English transfer-level courses.
 - ◆ Equity Designation: Highest success rate for Latinx students in English transfer-level courses.

- Campuswide Transfer-Level Math Success
 - ◆ Highest success rate for all students in math transfer-level courses
 - ◆ Equity Designation: Highest throughput rate for Black students in math transfer-level courses.
 - ◆ Equity Designation: Highest throughput rate for Latinx students in math transfer-level courses.

- Growth in Transfer-Level Course Success
 - ◆ Highest growth in success rate from the previous year in English transfer-level courses.
 - ◆ Highest growth in success rate from the previous year in Math transfer-level courses.

Percentage Point Gap Minus One

To identify campuses that are closing equity gaps, the Campaign for College Opportunity is employing a Percentage Point Gap Minus One (PPG-1) methodology, where rates for the demographic subgroup of interest are compared the average of all other students enrolled.

Example 1: Enrollment PPG-1 for Black Students

$$PPG-1_{\text{Black}} = \frac{\text{Enroll in Transfer-Level}_{\text{Black}}}{\text{Cohort}_{\text{Black}}} - \frac{\text{Enroll in Transfer-Level}_{\text{Not Black}}}{\text{Cohort}_{\text{Not Black}}}$$

Example 2: Throughput PPG-1 for Latinx Students

$$PPG-1_{\text{Latinx}} = \frac{\text{Complete CL math}_{\text{Latinx}}}{\text{Cohort}_{\text{Latinx}}} - \frac{\text{Complete CL math}_{\text{Not Latinx}}}{\text{Cohort}_{\text{Not Latinx}}}$$

For each college, we first calculated the share of the 2022-2023 cohort that enrolled in transfer-level English and Math courses, as well as the share of those who successfully completed these courses within a year of initial enrollment—defined as “Success Rate.” Next, we calculated equivalent rates for each college’s Black and Latinx populations and compared those to the institution’s rates for all non-Black or non-Latinx students. Colleges where the Black/Latinx students had a rate that was equal to or exceeded the rate for the remainder of the institution’s students will have a PPGBlack/PPGLatinx that is positive.

In order to be eligible for an Equity Designation, colleges will have to meet each of the following criteria:

- Have a sufficiently robust cohort size of Black/Latinx students—defined as having at least 20 Black or 20 Latinx students.
- Have a PPG rate for Black or Latinx students above “-1.” This requires that Black/Latinx students are enrolled in transfer-level courses or are passing those courses at not more than 1% below the rate of the college’s other enrolled students.
- Those who meet the previous two benchmarks will then be sorted by the relevant rate for their subject and demographic subgroup of interest, with the best performers being selected to receive an Equity Designation.
