- College lacks an Associate Degree for Transfer web page to inform students; many other online Foothill transfer resources are outdated.
- While access for international students and non-residents to some UC and CSU has increased, it has decreased for CA residents.
- Counselors have less time for transfer counseling due to demands of 3SP and increased paperwork from evaluations of multiple transcripts from increased enrollment of online students.
- Lack of reliable data about transfer to CSU, independent and out-of-state institutions makes assessment challenging.

Progress Indicators (Metrics Update)

- 1. Did not identify first-time students with incomplete SEPs.
- 2. Met with Basic Skills Work Group 3/11/14 to learn more about Summer Bridge program. TWG initiated meetings with other workgroups as well.
- 3. As Equity Workgroup is still in its infancy, we have not collaborated yet.
- 4. College-wide focus on Associate Degrees for Transfer resulted in development of an anticipated 20 ADTs by 2014-2015.
