Join me, as today's briefing at 1 pm will focus on reflections of this one-year point.



This voice is especially important as we work on phased return to campus this summer and fall.

One of the ways to help our mental stressors is to find social connection. Let's be in community with each other. Please join me, our chancellor, and the board as we celebrate the tenure of amazingly talented, dedicated, and diverse faculty at Foothill.
