We have one less part-time faculty member going into 24-25.

Implementation of study groups outside the class setting and research into OER readings for philosophy courses. In Fall 2024, in line with the college as a whole, we have been focussed on RSI training and development of communication plans. As with the rest of the college, this has become the main focus of the department. Increased focus on communication and increased familiarity with the various tools at our disposal promises to have an impact on student success.

6. What actions identified in the Comprehensive Program Review (or most recent Annual Program Review if no Comprehensive Program Review) have you completed this year?

As mentioned above, there has been a redirection of our goals toward RSI. The previously identified goal of study groups had some success, but this has proven too complicated to coordinate outside of class setting and also places an undue burden on the instructor to essentially have mini-classes outside of class. There are still little group get togethers ahead of exams, but extra credit for study guide completion and a full class session for review seems to have better sustainable results. The chair has not been able to make time for Professional Development Leave and quality OER remains elusive. The time required for RSI training and implementation has taken up the bulk of departmental efforts toward improvement of classes. This training is ongoing in the philosophy dept. as it is across campus.

The preliminary communication plans are completed for all current courses. However, these will be continuously augmented as training programs continue throughout the college.

8. Explain the evidence the program used to evaluate progress and provide an update on progress.





The teacher lead discussion groups were an experiment in one class and while there was notable improvement for some of the students involved, there was limited participation due to it being outside of regular class time. Also, as mentioned above, it became clear that this couldn't be a set policy as it would require what amounted to extra class instruction outside of class. The OER search wasn't connected to data. However, an ongoing search for good sources proves relatively fruitless due to the constraints that philosophical literature presents. Finding translations that both present the philosophy well and capture the literary aspect of the writing is very difficult in OER sources. Most of what is out there is a jumble of bad translations in poorly organized databases. The shift in focus to RSI and the resources presented in training proves to be fruitful.
