RE: 2013 Transportation Survey

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#### Overview

Foothill students and employees were surveyed to gather information regarding their mode of transportation to and from the Foothill main campus. There were approximately 12,000 students enrolled in spring quarter of 2013. The survey was administered to 4,000 students (roughly one-third of enrollment) and the sample was made to represent the breakdown of Foothill's overall student enrollment (part-time students accounted for 60% of the sample and full-time students accounted for 40%). Of the 4,000 students, 511 completed the survey for a response rate of 13%. Full-time students were over represented, accounting for 56% of student respondents, but making up only 37% of the overall student population (Spring 2013 census). The survey was also administered to 677 Foothill employees with 145 completing the survey for a response rate of 21%.

#### *Survey Highlights:*

- Almost half of student respondents (42%) commute from San Jose (21%) or Mountain View (21%). Twenty percent of Foothill employee respondents also commute from San Jose, but Sunnyvale (13%) was the second most cited city.
- Among survey respondents, a higher percentage of Foothill employees respondents compared to students drive themselves to the main campus (94% vs. 70%). A higher percentage of employee respondents also do not carpool when compared to students (91% vs. 74%).
- A higher percentage of student respondents compared to employees cited a desire for expanded/improved public transportation (64% vs. 46%) and more resources and incentives for carpooling (7% vs. 20%).
- Among those respondents who suggested an expansion or improvement of public transportation, 34% addressed the high prices of fares and the long transit times.
- A higher percentage of Foothill employee respondents compared to students cited the need for better access/security for bikes (16% vs. 13%) and a shuttle connecting Foothill and De Anza (14% vs. 7%).
- Foothill employee respondents accounted for nearly all the suggestions for incentivizing the use of electric cars (6 of 8) and increasing the use of telecommunication equipment(4).

#### Methodology

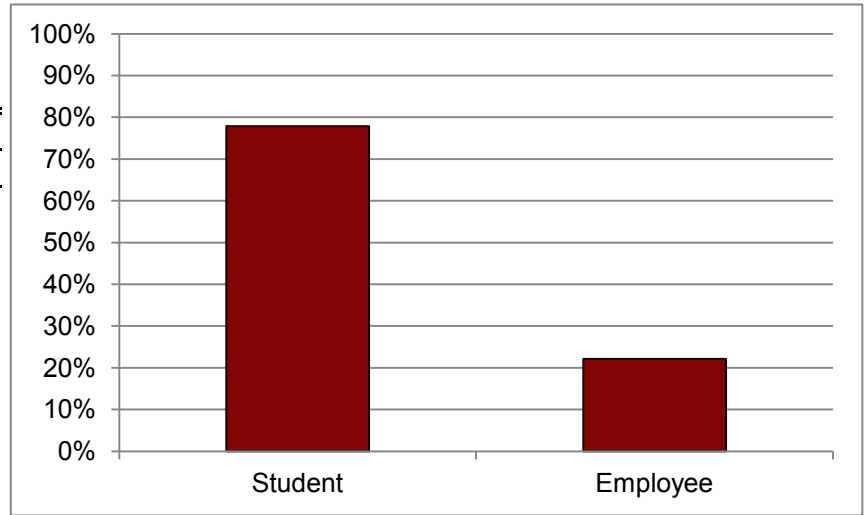
The survey was open from Monday, May 6, 2013 to Friday, May 17, 2013. A link to the transportation survey was sent out by email and made available on the portal to all employees on Monday, May 6. On Wednesday, May 8, the survey link was emailed to 4,000 students with an email reminder on Wednesday, May 15, 2013.

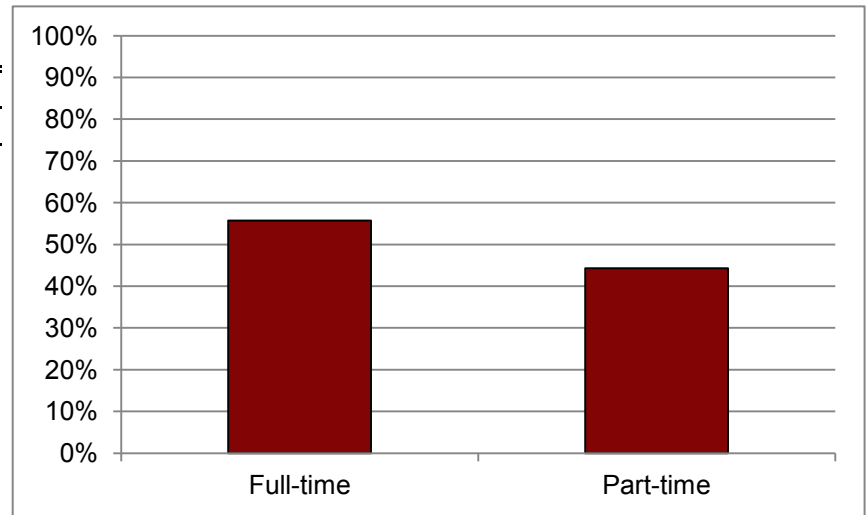
**1. Indicate your primary role at Foothill:**

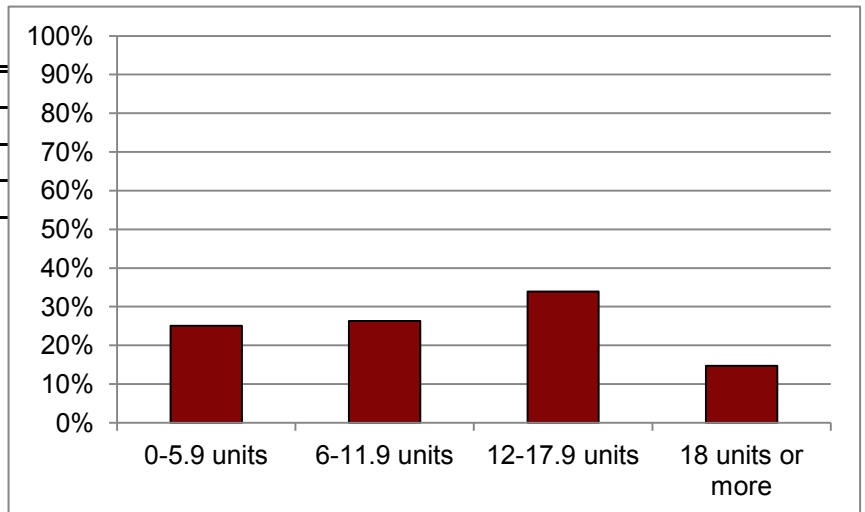
**2a. If you are a student, what is your enrollment status?**

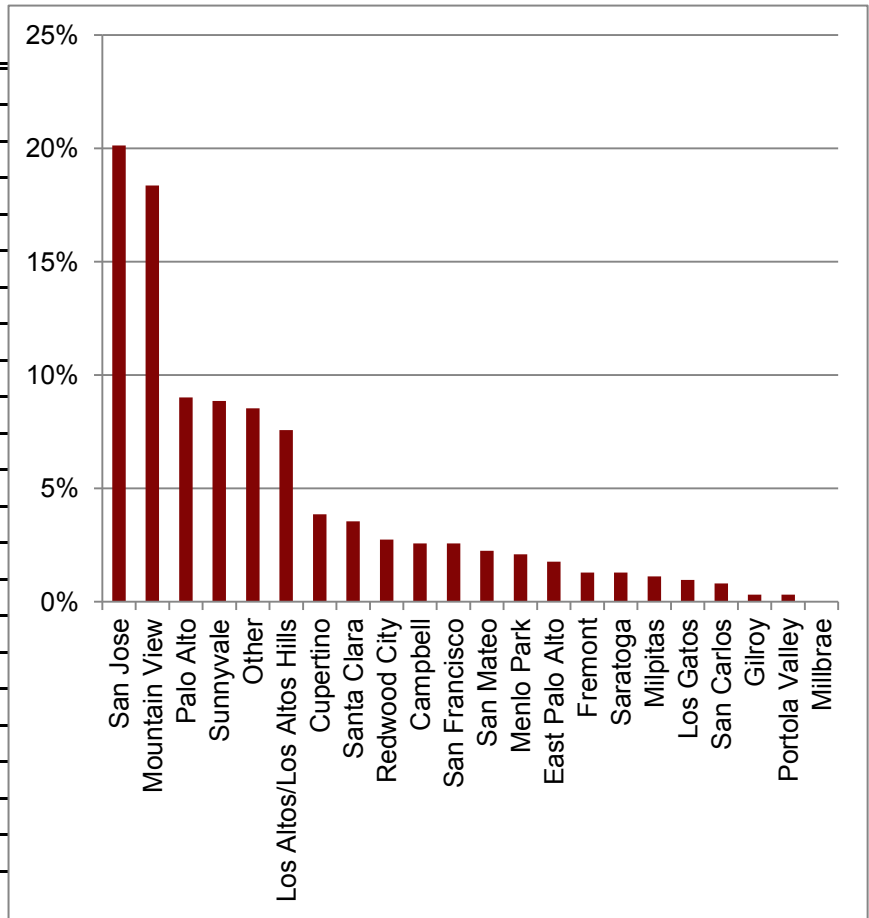

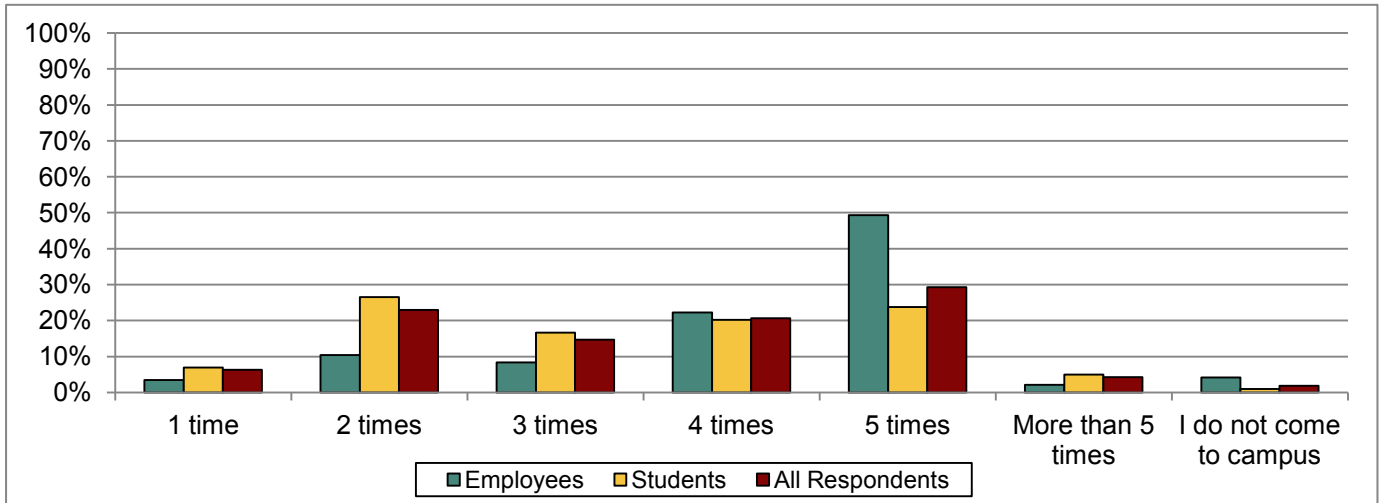

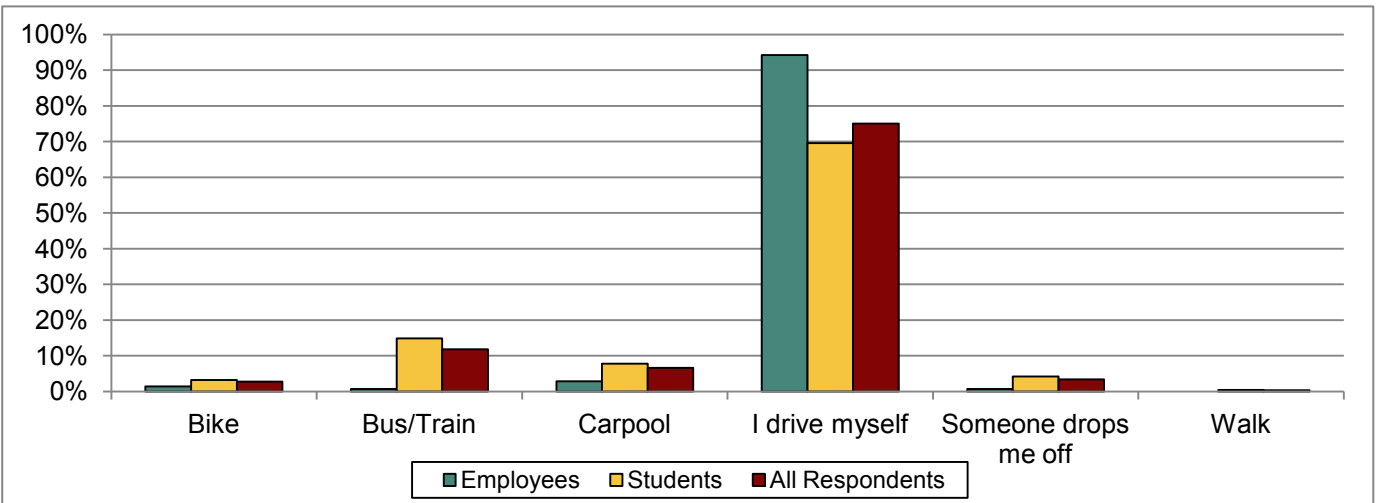

4. How often do you come to campus each week?



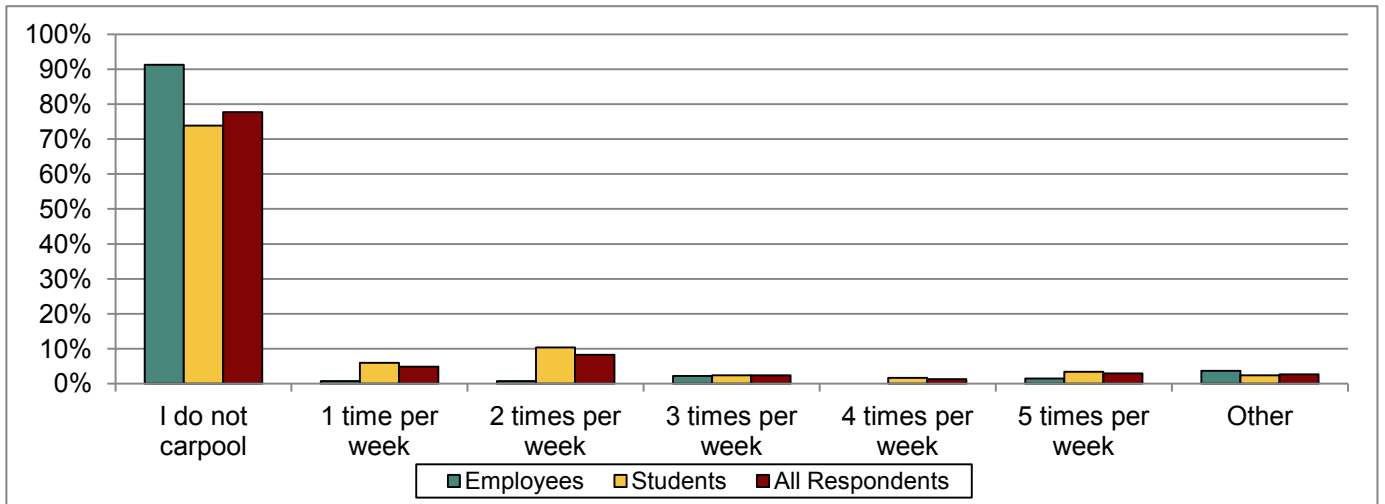

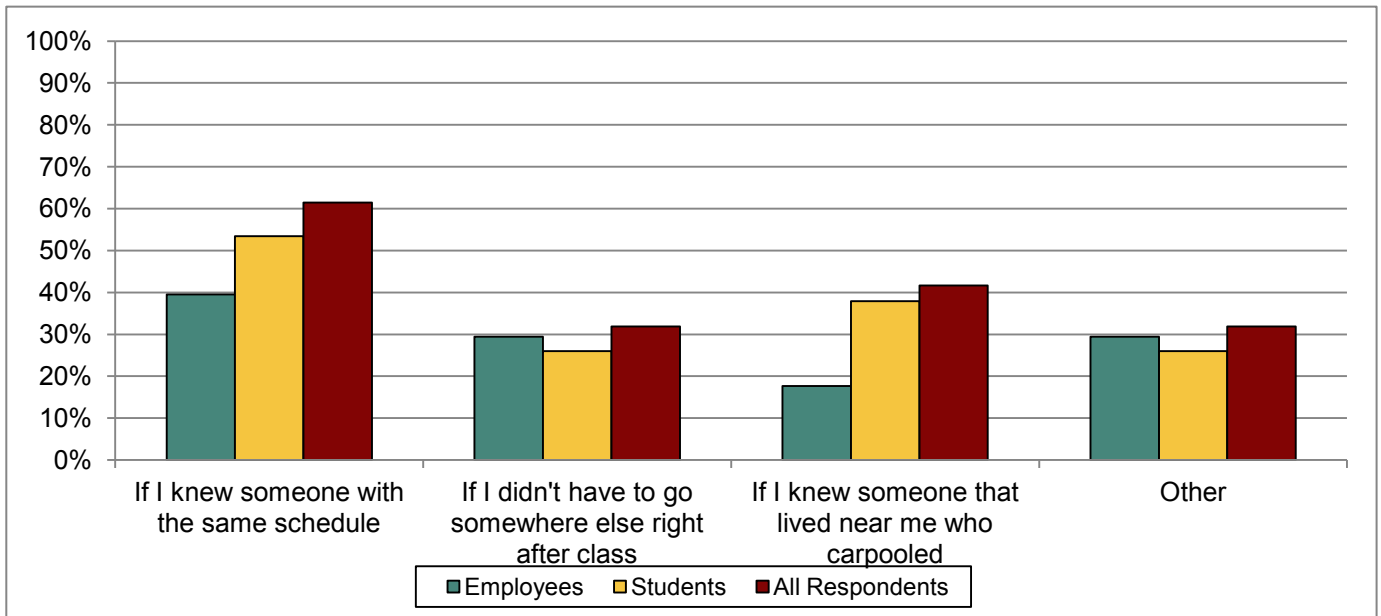

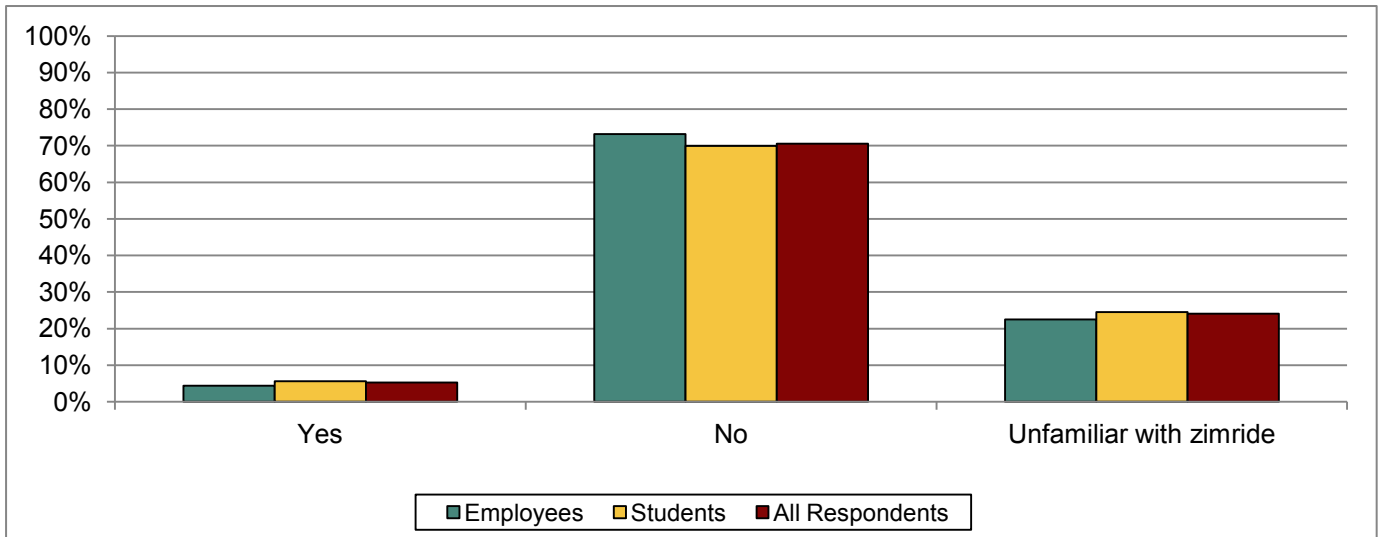
**7. What would make you more likely to carpool?(Select all that apply)**

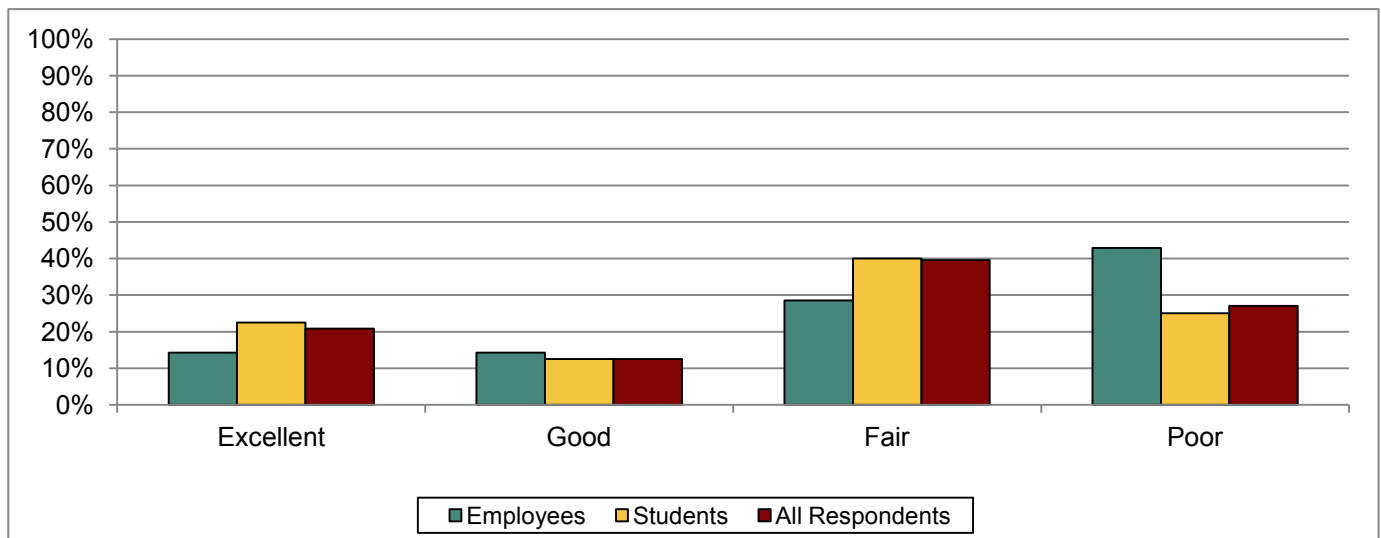

not enough faculty/staff using it. all students who need rides for 1-2 classes a day usually

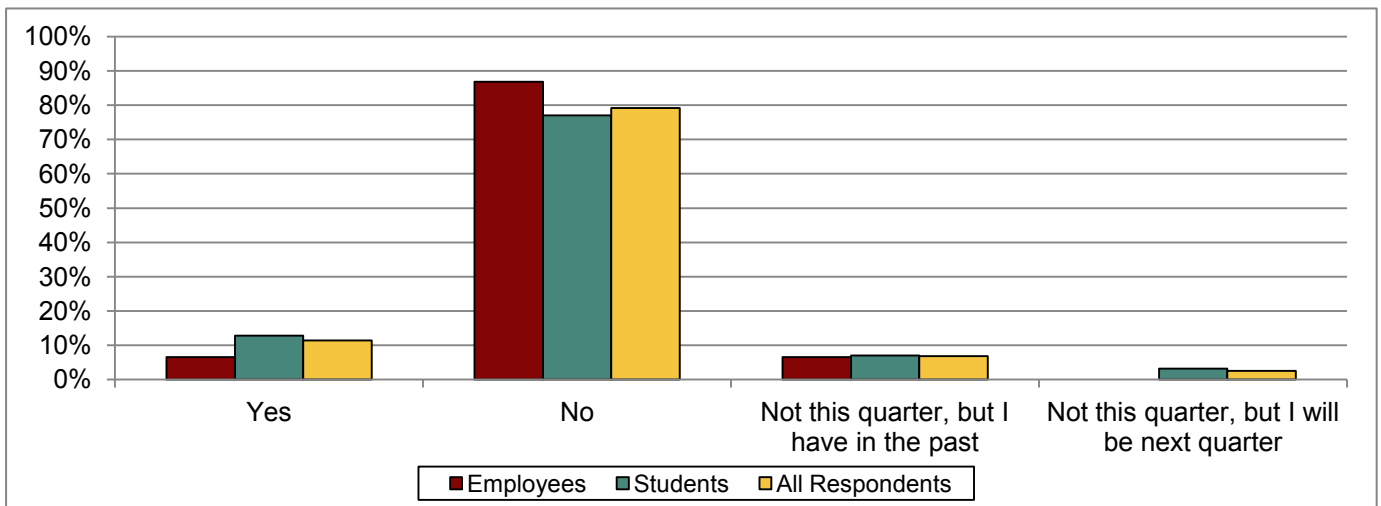
people do not respond

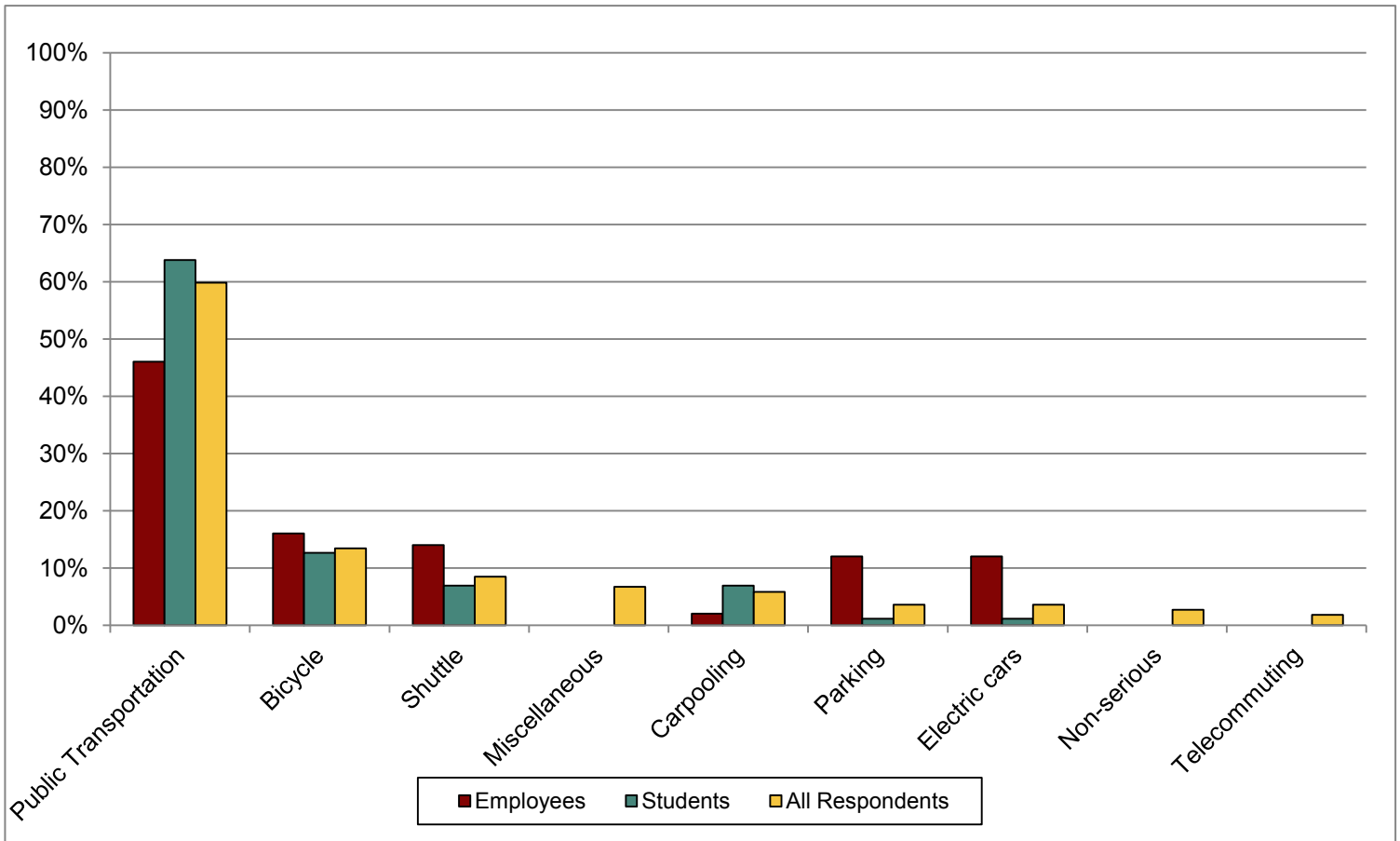
